Dear Parents/Carers,

I would like to apologise for the condition of the Infant Playground yesterday. Janitorial Services manage our school grounds and during icy/snowy weather, Janitors are advised to only grit a pedestrian route from the gate to the school building. Due to the position and shape of our school building, I feel it is necessary to ensure the back playground is also gritted as the majority of children have to walk through the playground when leaving or entering the school- as do many of you. Yesterday, I kept the children indoors all day while I contacted the Council in order to clarify the situation, however the playground was still very icy when the children were being collected from school at 3.00pm. I have now advised our Janitor to ensure the Playground is gritted on icy days. The health and safety of all our pupils and parents is very important to me and I hope this situation will not arise again in the future. I am trying to set up a meeting to further discuss this with the Janitorial Faculty Manager. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any queries regarding this.
