Just to remind you that Breakfast Club runs from 8.30 - 8.50 am. Breakfast club runs to ensure all children have access to a healthy breakfast to start off their day. All children are welcome. The children are provided with a healthy breakfast of cereal, toast and juice. There is no charge for this breakfast service. Once they have eaten the children go out into the playground from about 8.50 am. If the weather is poor the children stay in and go straight to class at 9.00. As this is not a child care service, we ask that children are not dropped off before 8.30am. There is also no formal supervision of

Good attendance at school is vital for your child to reach their full potential. If they are not at school, they are missing valuable learning experiences. Punctuality is also crucial as every minute in school is "Learning Time". At the moment I have noticed quite a few children arriving late in the morning – please try to get your child here on time to come into school with their line at 9.00a.m . If your child is late, they will be able to come into the school via their class door up until 9.05.am. After this time they will have to sign in at the School Office. Latecoming is very disruptive to the other learners in the class.
