Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you to all of you who were able to attend and support our Official Opening Ceremony on Monday 9th September. We were delighted that Mike Russell, the Cabinet Secretary for Education and Lifelong Learning, from the Scottish Government wanted to attend. He was very impressed with our school building and all the great learning which takes place inside it. He really enjoyed the pupil presentation. I have received a number of emails from South Lanarkshire Council colleagues commending our pupils and staff for a great ceremony. 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Learning across our school

Class Teachers have been preparing Class Newlsetters to keep you informed of the wonderful learning experiences they have been planning with and for our pupils. Teachers regularly consult with pupils regarding their learning and ensure that the children have a say in how the Topic work develops.

Last week we welcomed two visitors from Education Scotland who were interested in speaking to some of our P5-P7 pupils about their views on Technologies in school. The pupils contributed confidently to this discussion and were commended for their enthusiasm.

Our School Assemblies are taking place on a Monday afternoon this term. We have been focussing on our school vision and values and involving the children in sharing ideas and deepening our understanding of what these mean to us. Pupils from across the school have been contributing to these Assemblies. Next term we will focus on the wellbeing factors (SHANARRI). This stands for Safe, Healthy, Active, Nurtured, Respected, Responsible and Included. Teachers have been introducing these terms in classes and highlighting their importance for everyone.

Primary 3 and Mrs Clark and Mr Miller are busy preparing for our Harvest Service which will take place at Blairbeth Church on Friday 11th October at 10am. We hope you will be able to join us. Shortly you will receive an invitation and a request for donations of food which we will give to the Lodging House Mission.

Primary 3 will be collecting Nestle Boxtop tokens this school year to get free books for our school. Many Nestle cereals have the rectangular token on the top of the box, so all you have to do is cut out the token and send it to school. The pupils in Primary 3 will collect them weekly and for every token your child brings to school, they will receive a 'thank you' sticker from Nestle. Spittal Primary School have participated in the Nestle Boxtops for Books scheme for over 5 years and so far, our school has received between 5 and 15 new books each year. We hope to get even more free books this year for our lovely new school library.

Primary 4 and Primary 5 are enjoying a block of Health Drive activities on a Thursday afternoon. Workshops for Parents and pupils have started and include activities such as food tasting and preparation, Zumba, art, games and learning about healthy eating. Karen Robertson, Home Partnership Worker and Mrs Mechan have been leading this exciting new project, with Mrs Laccarini, Miss Fillingham and Miss Beatts contributing to the planning and delivery activities.

Primary 7 have started a block of swimming lessons on a Thursday afternoon.

Health and Safety at PE

South Lanarkshire Policy states that children should not wear jewellery during PE activities. This is for safety reasons as accidents can happen and children can suffer injury from wearing earrings, necklaces etc in the Gym Hall. Pupil Voice

Our new Pupil Council have been elected and had their first meeting with Mrs Mechan and myself recently. During this meeting we asked the children what kinds of responsibilities they would like the opportunity to participate in. We were delighted with the very enthusiastic response and will ensure we regularly consult with our pupils. I will be meeting regularly with Pupil Council Representatives to talk to them about their learning experiences in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy.

Mrs Mechan and Rebecca and Conner (last year's Junior Road Safety Officers) conducted interviews for this years JRSOs recently. The standard was very high with lots of P6 pupils expressing their interest via a letter. The result of the interviews was that our JRSOs for 2013-2014 are Abbie Hence and Louise Gallacher. Abby and Louise have already started working on their noticeboard and gathered information from all pupils about their journey to school last Friday. This was part of the national Annual School Travel Survey.

The Eco-Committee have been busy already this term. With 22 pupil members from Primary 1 to Primary 7, a parent member and staff members, the committee have had 2 meetings and a school grounds clean-up before our opening ceremony. We have applied for free saplings for our school grounds which should arrive in early November. The children have loads of great ideas and they're enthusiastic to apply for Green Flag status this session. Here are some of their ideas:

- Each class to have a Power Ranger and a Paper Ranger: A pupil who makes sure lights, computer monitors and the interactive whiteboard projectors are switched off. Also, a pupil who puts scrap paper into the recycling bag and ensures that 1 paper towel per pupil is used.
- At an assembly, the Eco-committee will talk about litter in the playground and ask teachers and classes to use 'smart pals' as often as possible to save paper.

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- All classes can plant vegetables in the large playground planters in the spring and once they've grown, pupils could take them home or make soup in school.
- An Eco-action day: Pupils have a whole day of outdoor learning including litter picking and building a greenhouse from recyclable materials.
- Make birdfeeders from recyclable materials for each class to be responsible for.
- Put a fruit bin in the dinner hall so fruit scraps can be added to our school compost bins.
- Barrels could be placed in the playground to collect rainwater for indoor and outdoor plants.

Parent Council News


Visitors to School
